

## Substandard Housing Maximum Value Limit per County

Effective immediately, for purposes of the HTF Emergency Repair and Owner-Occupied Rehabilitation activities, property will **NOT** be considered substandard or eligible for repair, if the property's tax assessed value (land plus improvements) exceeds the following maximum amount per county:
