Points are awarded for sites within 500' of a "Public Transit Stop" in the LPU Setaside. TriCounty Link serves Berkeley, Charleston, and Dorchester Counties. According to the agencies brochure, this is a flagstop system. Access to a bus can be gained by standing at one of the established, timed bus stops, or a bus can be flagged down at a safe location anywhere along the bus route. If a site is within 150' or 500' of an intersection or other safe place to flag the bus along the bus route, is it eligible for points?
